Proudest moment in business: A residential client asked me to design a grandchildren's garden complete with a playhouse and water feature. I made several cement board games and had the grandma and grandpa put their handprints in the cement for their grandchildren to forever be able to "hold hands" with them. It turned out magical A few years afterward, the grandparents passed away and one of the granddaughters came up to me and said, "Thank you for doing that." The garden is amazing to this day.

Biggest business challenge: I really don't find any big challenges in my business, and for that I am grateful. I have a truly amazing client base full of people who trust my creativity, as well as a family that not only works with me but supports all of my very whimsical ways.

Best sources of landscape design/build inspiration: Nature is most inspiring for me. I find all my creative landscapes come from nature.

steps and several small stone and bark paths. We used a log picker and truck
to put the logs in place. The logging theme design is perfect for them.
Adding a stamped patio will only make the landscape better as it grows.

I would like to stretch my TV series, "Garden Wise Living," to more online channels and do more marketing for independent garden centers with video content on how-to topics to play at their garden centers. I want to have open gathering gardens and independent garden and learning centers.
